## Advanced manufacturing class enrolling students

Butler Technology and Career Development Schools is enrolling adult students for its next Advanced Manufacturing Technology class that runs Nov. 11 to Nov. 20, 2014.

The evening class is held 5:15 to 9:45 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays, at the school's main campus, 3603 Hamilton-Middletown Road/Ohio 4, Fairfield Twp.

The curriculum covers automation systems and robotics, basic machining, basic welding, industrial controls and programmable logic controllers, industrial electricity, industrial fluid power, industrial mechanics, industrial safety, manufacturing and maintenance fundamentals, production processes, and quality and continuous improvement.

Upon completing the class, students can test for Manufacturing Skills Standards Council certifications in safety, quality, manufacturing processes, and maintenance, according to Butler Tech.

Class eligibility requirements include a high school diploma and a score of 4 or higher on the skills test WorkKeys.

Once prospective students receive passing scores on the test, they can enroll with Butler Tech.

The Advanced Manufacturing program was started in 2010 to respond to the need of local manufacturers for employees with more technical skills.
