City of Fairfield recognized by Ohio EPA for Source Water Assessment and Protection Program

The City of Fairfield was recently recognized by the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio EPA) for its diligence in ground water protection. On Monday, June 8th, Allison Reed from the Ohio EPA presented Mayor Steve Miller with a certificate which commended the City's efforts in drinking water source protection, outreach and education, collaboration with other local water suppliers, and proactive groundwater monitoring. Fairfield is just the second community in Southwest Ohio to receive such recognition.

Mayor Miller commented on Fairfield's drinking water source: "We realize it is a valuable commodity. We've tried to be at the forefront...to protect the aquifer."

Source water protection is a federal program administered by Ohio EPA that is aimed at helping public water systems protect their drinking water resources. The City's involvement with source water protection goes back almost 30 years. Fairfield is a charter member of the Hamilton to New Baltimore Ground

Water Consortium, a group of water suppliers that also includes the cities of Hamilton and Cincinnati, Southwest Regional Water District, Southwestern Ohio Water Company, Miller Coors, and Butler County Water and Sewer. The primary objective of the Consortium is to implement and maintain a ground water protection plan that prevents contaminants from impacting the Great Miami Buried Valley Aquifer – the local underground source of the Consortium's drinking water.

"Our region is fortunate to have such an excellent source of clean drinking water - just beneath our feet is one of the world's best and most productive aquifer systems. Fairfield and the other Consortium members recognize the importance of this resource and are passionate about protecting it – through zoning rules, chemical inventories, water emergency response efforts and contingency planning" stated Andreas Eddy, Public Utilities Superintendent for Fairfield. Fairfield pumped and treated 1.9 billion gallons from the aquifer in 2014.

"The collaboration amongst Consortium members is a model within the State. Through this partnership, members are better able to protect water resources on a regional level, versus 'going it alone'. Collectively we have more resources to successfully implement our plan, and by pooling resources we save our rate-payers money," said Adam Sackenheim, Public Utilities Director for Fairfield.

Fairfield has the 4th lowest combined water and sewer rates in Southwest Ohio, according to a 2015 study conducted by the City of Oakwood.





Leaf Collection

Fairfield's annual leaf collection is scheduled to begin Monday, November 2, 2015 on the streets west of Pleasant Avenue. The second week will see the areas between Pleasant and Winton Road collected, with the third week being dedicated to the areas east of Winton. This order will repeat itself in the following weeks for a total of three collection weeks per zone.

This program provides free leaf collection services to residents who place leaves in rows or piles between the curb and sidewalk or adjacent to the street in areas not having curb and sidewalk. Residents are advised to

NOT place leaves in the street, as gutters and storm sewers can become blocked and cause localized flooding during moderate to heavy rainfall. Also, please do not park in front of or near the piles between the hours of 7:00am and 8:00pm as the trucks/equipment cannot reach them, those piles will be

left until the next scheduled collection week. Do not place grass clippings, sticks, limbs or brush in with your leaves. These items can clog and damage our equipment and could injure workers.



Fairfield Police Department: "The Gold Standard"

The vision of the Fairfield Police Department is "to be recognized as **The Standard** for police services by our peers and our community."

That vision was put to the test when the Fairfield Police Department underwent its fifth accreditation review by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The members of the police department volunteered to be assessed by CALEA's Gold Standard process. This voluntary format focuses primarily on processes and outcomes associated with standards specific to agency policies. In short, it works to measure the impact of accreditation standards as opposed to simply confirming compliance through a file-file review.



A review team from CALEA arrived in April and spent four days interviewing agency personnel and members of the community and submitted a report to CALEA. On Saturday, July 25, 2015, Chief Mike Dickey and Sgt. Kevin Rednour, accreditation manager for the police department, appeared before a committee of commissioners for an in-person review of the results of the assessment. At the conclusion, the Commission approved the award of Advanced Accreditation with Excellence for the Fairfield Police Department.

The Excellence Award is to recognize agencies for the effective use of accreditation as a model for the delivery of enhanced services and management professionalism.

"The agency's dedication to service with integrity and compassion is commendable, especially in today's law enforcement world."

Chief Dickey said, "Within our review group of 23 agencies, we were one of only two agencies receiving an Advanced Accreditation with Excellence Award. Ninety-one agencies in total were reviewed during this conference in Colorado Springs Colorado".

The assessment team concluded in its report to the commission "Overall, the FPD has done an excellent job of building a strong foundation of professional police practices. The agency's dedication to service with integrity and compassion is commendable, especially in today's law enforcement world."

Chief Dickey stated that this award would not be possible without the high level of day-to-day work accomplished for the residents and visitors to Fairfield by the employees of the police department. The recognition awarded to the department is a direct result of the individual effort put forth by each employee and could not have been accomplished without their individual and collective contributions, and the support of the City Manager, Mayor and members of Council.

After The Fire

In November 2014, an overnight fire destroyed the former Sabor Peruano restaurant at 7105 Dixie Highway. After an investigation, it was determined that



the fire started in the building's ventilation system. A malfunction in the fire suppression system contributed to the fire spread. By the time it was extinguished, the building was a total loss.

Nine months later, three restaurants are planning new projects as a result of the devastating fire.

Skyline and Bargas New Construction

Construction is well underway on a new multi-tenant building to replace the burned down building. The new building will house Skyline Chili and Bargas Grill & Tap, which are both scheduled to open in October.



The existing Skyline Chili that is about a half-mile south on Route 4 will relocate and will lease more than half of the new building. Skyline owner Dave Hummel

is excited about the new location, which will be significantly larger than his existing restaurant. It will feature a modern design, and have much better access and visibility for customers. "We want to be here for a long time, so we're going to do it right," Dave said.

Bargas Grill & Tap will relocate from Springdale into the other portion of the building. It features a traditional sports bar menu. In addition to indoor seating, Bargas will also feature a covered patio with outdoor seating.

Sabor Peruano Finds New Location

Sabor Peruano, a restaurant serving Peruvian fare, had been open in Fairfield for nearly eight years before the fire destroyed everything. Owner Mary Tiacala was devastated. "All my work went up in flames. It was hard."

Tiacala wasted little time identifying a new location. The new site is at 7425 Dixie Highway (near the Ohio Valley Antique Mall), only about a half-mile south of the former site. The new location offers more space as well as private rooms for special events. The new Sabor Peruano is expected to open in August. 🌐



New Homes Coming To Village Green

Construction recently started on eight new landminium homes in Village Green. The development, named "The Cove at Village Green", was approved by the Planning Commission and Fairfield City Council in May.

The development will include eight two-story homes on a 1.6 acre site at Corydale Drive and City Center Lane, across from the Fairfield Lane Library. Each unit will contain about 1800 square feet and will be priced at nearly \$200,000. Units are designed with a first floor master bedroom, and include a rear porch that faces a common open space.



"We are excited to bring these landminiums to Village Green," said Patrick Merten, a representative of Hearthstone Holdings. "We think these homes will appeal to people that want to own a single-family detached house in a walkable neighborhood but don't want to maintain a yard anymore. We are receiving a substantial amount of interest."



Landminiums are properties in which the owner owns both the structure and the land underneath the structure. A homeowners association will be created to take care of the grounds and other common spaces.

Alba Manufacturing Expansion

Alba Manufacturing is located at 8950 Seward Road in Fairfield. The company designs, engineers and manufactures heavy-duty pallet conveyor systems for a variety of industries, including food and beverage, automotive, aerospace, warehouse, distribution, chemical, and materials processing.

Alba was established in 1973, and moved into Fairfield when it built a

67,000 square foot facility in 2001.

Due to steady growth and increased product demand in recent years, Alba needs additional manufacturing space. It is planning to construct a 21,000 square foot warehouse addition and install new machin-




ery and equipment. Total new investment is estimated at more than \$2.4 million.

Alba currently employs more than 70 workers and plans to add additional jobs when construction is complete. Its employees include highly skilled and experienced engineers, sales, service, and production workers. 🌐

According to General Manager Jerry Smith, Camping World purchased the Tom Raper operation because it wanted to be in this market. "We believe in this area so much, that's why we wanted to be here." He credits his 50 employees with ensuring continued success at this location. "Our

employees, most of whom come from the Fairfield area, are so good and really are the lifeblood of our operation."

Anyone who has driven on this section of Route 4 recently has no doubt noticed the 80'x40' American flag flying above the store. All Camping World stores have a similar sized flags to represent the American spirit and traveling the open road.



Firefall



FAIRFIELD PARKS AND RECREATION MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Fairfield Parks and Recreation is to enrich the quality of life for the citizens of the community, sustain the City's natural resources and environment and provide broad based leisure activities, cultural opportunities, facilities and services for all ages.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WINTER WEATHER POLICY

At times, unforeseen circumstances can disrupt operations and force management to cancel programs. In making these determinations, Management Staff carefully considers the safety and security of the general public and department staff.

CLASSES are defined as registered or drop-in programs that are leader-directed and offered at a predetermined time.

ACTIVITIES are self-directed programs or services that do not require registration.

SCHEDULED EVENTS are defined as meetings, private rentals, theatre rentals, theatre productions and special events taking place at a facility during a predetermined time.

CANCELLATIONS: The decision to conduct CLASSES during normal hours of operation will be made by 8 am whenever possible.

The department will issue cancellation announcements through its current media outlets, city website and signage at facilities. Information will also be available on the automated hotline at 896-8400.

WHEN FAIRFIELD CITY SCHOOLS CLOSE:

If Fairfield City Schools close due to inclement winter weather, all CLASSES offered through the Parks and Recreation Department/Fairfield Community Arts Center will be canceled until 4 p.m. The decision to conduct evening classes starting at 4 p.m. or later will be made by 2 p.m. Any CLASSES that are scheduled at a Fairfield City School location will be canceled for that evening as well. CLASSES that occur during a time period that school is closed for Winter Break or a Holiday will take place and follow the SCHEDULED EVENTS and ACTIVITIES guidelines. If facilities remain open, all SCHEDULED EVENTS and ACTIVITIES will occur as planned. Clients with SCHEDULED EVENTS may choose to cancel their events.

Winterizing your Swimming Pool

Falling leaves and cold weather can mean potential damage to your pool and pool equipment. Taking these weatherization steps now could save you costly repairs next summer.

1. Conduct a final pool water test to verify water is balanced.
2. Clean and vacuum pool thoroughly.
3. Clean skimmer and lint trap.
4. Clean filter per manufacturer's recommendation.
5. Chlorinate and algacide pool water per manufacturer's recommendation.
6. Add pool winterizing anti-freeze to pipes and equipment.
7. Cover your pool to protect from leaves, dirt and debris.

The pool cover should be tight so that no more than 4" of water can collect on the top. For above ground pools, the ladder should be removed or locked. For in-ground pools, the gates

to the yard should latch closed preventing access by children. Storable pools must be removed from the yard in the off-season. Fairfield Codified Ordinance, Section 1343.03(i)(7) states:

"Storable pools are those that are constructed above ground with a maximum depth of 42 inches, or a pool with nonmetallic wall or inflatable fabric wall of any size. All storable pools are required to be removed from service and stored away between the period of **November 1st and April 1st.**"



Duke Warns About Bill Pay Scam

Duke Energy is seeing an increase in reports from customers in the region about a utility bill payment scam and is urging its Ohio and Kentucky customers to be alert.

Energy never asks or requires customers who have delinquent accounts to purchase a prepaid debit card to avoid electric service disconnection."

Under the scam, a customer receives an unsolicited phone call from an individual who falsely claims to be a Duke Energy representative.



The caller falsely warns that Duke Energy will disconnect the customer's electric service if the customer fails to make an immediate payment – usually within one hour.

"The scammers have become more sophisticated and the caller ID on your phone might even state that it is a call from Duke Energy," said Jim Holstein, manager of Duke Energy's Midwest Call Center Operations. "In reality, Duke

Customers can make payments online, by phone, by automatic bank draft, by mail or in person.

Duke Energy customers who have delinquent accounts receive

an advance disconnect notification with their regular monthly billing – never just a single notification one hour before disconnection.

The company urges customers who suspect or experience fraud to hang up and call local police, then call Duke Energy in Ohio/Kentucky at 1-800-544-6900. Customers should not use the telephone number provided by the scammer.

Construction Improvements Scheduled For Two Major Fairfield Roads

City Council recently awarded a contract to the John R. Jurgensen Company for the construction of improvements to Nilles Road between Route 4 and Hicks Boulevard. This construction contract also includes improvements to Gray Road between John Gray Road and Lake Michigan Drive.

A total of \$1,791,214.00 in total funding was requested by Public Works for the completion of this contract for both roads. Funding sources include an Ohio

Public Works Commission Grant of approximately \$600,000.00 and local funds from the Street Improvement Fund in the amount of \$1,191,214.00.

This project includes storm sewer improvements, concrete improvements, base failure repairs as needed, thermoplastic pavement markings, raised pavement markers, and resurfacing of Nilles Road from May Avenue to Route 4 (including Stadium Drive) and Gray Road from Lake Michigan to John Gray Road.

The Nilles Road section is also being designed for a left turn into the Arbor Pointe apartment complex just west of Route 4. The Gray Road section will include the addition of paved shoulders for most of the length of the project. These improvements will make for a safer roadway for the traveling public.



Public Input Requested for Thomas O. Marsh Park Expansion Master Plan

The Fairfield Parks and Recreation Department is currently developing a Thomas O. Marsh Park Expansion Master Plan and is interested in acquiring public input.

The existing Marsh Park, located at 6440 River Road, is a 30 acre park that offers a paved bike/walking path and pay fishing lake. Through an agreement with Martin Marietta, adjacent property to the north will be conveyed to the City of Fairfield for public use. The Marsh Park expansion will also include current City property to the southwest known as Black Bottom. Upon completion, Marsh Park will total 170 acres, 60 of which will be water.

The Kleingers Group has been retained by the City of Fairfield for the conceptual design of the park expansion. The City of Fairfield is exploring potential partnerships with other environmental and recreation agencies.

Rules Regarding Open Burning

The City of Fairfield, in compliance with the Southwest Ohio Air Quality Agency, prohibits any form of open burning that involves garbage, waste materials containing rubber, grease, asphalt or any other material containing petroleum products. Open burning cannot be used to dispose of yard waste, tree trimmings or other vegetation.

Campfires and fire pits are permitted with wood stacks no larger than 3 feet in diameter and no higher than 2 feet. Use only clean,



seasoned fire wood. Residents must be vigilant of the amount of smoke being generated so it does not create a nuisance.

The Fairfield Fire Department receives numerous complaints about excessive smoke or extraordinarily large fires that create a nuisance for those living nearby. If found to be creating such a nuisance, the Fairfield Fire Department will request that the homeowner extinguish the fire, otherwise appropriate actions will be initiated.

Facts about Fairfield Income Tax

Avoid the lines by filing early. File your 2015 tax return as soon as you have all the required documents, such as W-2s and/or schedules.

Who has to file?

All residents of the City of Fairfield, all retirees, all residents 18 and older and residents 16 years and older (if working) must file an income tax return. Filing before April 15, 2016 will avoid long lines. If requesting an extension to file, the account must be in good standing.

Why does a return have to be filed?

Fairfield has mandatory filing which ensures that any and all earnings are reported and any tax due is remitted to the City.

Where is Income Tax?

Income Tax is located in the Annex Building, located at 701 Wessel Drive, 867-5327. Hours are Monday through Friday, 8 to 5.

Fourth Quarterly Estimate Payment due by 1/31/16.

Taxpayers, who owe more than \$200.00, need to make their fourth quarter estimate payment no later than January 31, 2016 to avoid possible \$50.00 penalty. Estimated payments must total at least 90% of current year liability.

The Tax Division has an after hours deposit slot in the lobby available for making payments when the office is closed.
