

Summer sewer credits to begin for residents

Summer will make its arrival... eventually. When it does, residents will begin turning their attention to swimming pools, yard work and lawn care. That outdoor work likely will involve the use of water, much of which will not return to the sanitary sewer system.

The City of Fairfield has a program in place that provides credits to residents so they are not paying sewer charges on the additional water that never enters the sewer. The program, called the *Summer Irrigation Credit*, takes an average of winter water use from November to February, then stops summer sewer fees for any amount over 150 percent of that level of water usage for the months May through through September.

Here's how it works: If a household from

- November to February uses 6,000, 7,500, 8,000 and 6,800 gallons of water, their average use would be 7,075 gallons of water, for which they are charged water fees and sewer fees. During the summer in this example, sewer charges would be capped at 10,613 gallons of usage from May 1 through September 30. Residents, of course, will still pay for the water they use, but not for sewer charges above 150 percent of their winter average.
- The automatic summer irrigation credit eliminates the need for residents to make special requests or pick-up special meters for measuring water used to fill up a pool or other outdoor use. Those who must fill a pool or who experience a water leak outside the summer months can call the Utility Billing Office at 867-5370 to request a credit for the

- excess sewer charges. Typically, the homeowner would be asked for some documentation of a need, such as a pool liner replacement or water line repair.

Aquatic Center earns safety honor

Nothing is as important to the operation of a public swimming facility as safety. To ensure its lifeguarding staff is as prepared as possible, Fairfield's Aquatic Center depends on the training and certification of the highly respected organization of Ellis & Associates, which has been recognized as a safety authority by insurance companies nationally since the 1980s.

The Aquatic Center received the prestigious Gold International Aquatic Safety Award from Ellis & Associates for operations in 2012. Bestowed on only the top 30 percent of facilities reviewed by the organization, the award assures patrons and parents that the highest degree of swimmer protection is in place at the Aquatic Center. A Gold Award was also earned in 2011 and 2009, in addition to a Silver Award in 2010. Additionally,



- Lifeguards have received individual recognition from the organization, including Golden Guard recognition for Erin Jantzen last year.
- In order to further develop the skills and professionalism of the City's lifeguard team, the Fairfield Aquatic Center became an Ellis affiliate when it opened in 1997. Fairfield lifeguards must complete a rigorous training and testing process in order to be certified through Ellis' National Pool and Waterpark Lifeguard Program. To maintain their certification, they must participate in regular, in-service training throughout the season. To assure that each lifeguard is performing his or her duties properly, Ellis representatives perform regular, anonymous on-site audits. As part of the audit process, lifeguards may be videotaped and rated on a range of performance criteria, from posture to scanning techniques.



Simple twist can thwart home burglary

A simple movement can stop a thief in his tracks. TWIST THE WRIST! That's right, a simple twist of the wrist to lock a door or window will prevent a burglar from making an easy entry. Forget about the integrity of your lock. Even the best and biggest lock on the strongest door is worthless if it is not used.

No, there has NOT been a sudden increase in crime in the City. In fact, overall crime is down in Fairfield and remains below statistical averages when compared to nearby cities and statewide figures. Burglaries in the City have declined over the years and remain 17 percent below the City's 10-year average.

In too many cases, officers taking reports note that a door or window was left unlocked, allowing a thief easy access. During 2012, out of the City's 194 burglaries, 72 did not involve any force to enter, which means a door or window was unlocked (90 incidents were the

result of force and in 32 cases, an entry was attempted but was not successful). In 2011, out of 224 burglaries, 72 cases did not involve force (130 involved force, with 22 cases of attempted — but unsuccessful — entry).

Most criminals are lazy. Often, they check doors until they find one that opens. Then, the temptation is too strong not to enter for a quick score. For most, a fast getaway with something of value is all they desire. But once inside, who knows what goes through the mind of a hardened criminal. Some of the nation's most horrific crimes started with an unlocked door or open window.

Don't take a chance. TWIST THE WRIST! You'll likely never know how important that simple movement can be.

Vacation Plans?

Be sure to call the Police Department at 829-8201 so an officer can make periodic checks on your property. Be sure to stop mail/newspaper deliveries and have a trusted neighbor or family member pick up sale papers. If possible, use a timer on lights to give the home an occupied look. And be sure to lock all doors and windows!

The evidence is in: new life for old unit

Fairfield's Crime Scene Investigation (CSI) vehicle is well equipped with sophisticated technology critical to gathering important evidence. New, more advanced gear can now be purchased with funds saved by refurbishing the vehicle which transports it to a crime scene.

If the truck looks like a life squad... well, that's because it **was** a life squad at one time. The vehicle was first used by the Fire Department in 1994, then retired it in 2003 when a new squad was placed in service. While the squad was deemed outdated for daily runs, it still had plenty of service life left for use by the Police Department. After using it ten years for tactical needs, the truck was still in great shape for use as a CSI unit. After all, a CSI vehicle in Fairfield doesn't exactly see a lot of use.

While the outside was in perfectly good shape, the chassis was in need of service. Rather than buy a new vehicle, a new chassis was all that was needed to get another 15 years of service from the unit.

So the City invested \$34,500 to install the new chassis. Of that amount, \$20,600 was covered by a federal grant,

requiring only \$13,900 of local funds to provide a like-new vehicle for use through 2028.

Building investment on the rise in Fairfield

Recent data provides hope that the economic recession is easing in Fairfield. The year of 2012 was the strongest for building construction activity since the nationwide economic downturn began in 2008. During the year, valuations on building permits totaled \$30.5 million, a 39% increase over 2011 totals. Commercial investment totaled \$22.5 million, while residential investment totaled \$8 million. Hopefully these rebounding numbers will continue in 2013.

Kroger fuel center to open by summer

Kroger will soon begin construction of a new fuel center in the Town Center area (at the southeast corner of Pleasant Avenue and Nilles Road). The retail site has sat vacant for several years.

The City and Kroger collaborated in a lengthy design process in order to create a fuel facility that blended with the architectural character of the Town Center. Some key features include a small convenience store in lieu of Kroger's standard kiosk, all brick



structures, extensive landscaping, and a restricted right-in only entrance on Pleasant Avenue with a full service entrance on Nilles Road.

Demolition and site clearance is expected to be underway as soon as weather permits, with the new facility projected to be open by Summer 2013.

Koch Foods

In summer 2012, Koch Foods announced a major expansion that would significantly increase jobs and production at its Port Union Road facility. Shortly after the expansion announcement was made, however, the company delayed the project due to uncertain grain prices. In January, the project finally began with underground utility work and site clearance. The major portion



of the expansion is expected to begin later this year. The expansion will add 185,000 square feet in production space, nearly doubling the facility's size. The expansion will also create about 400 new jobs when the work is completed.

Mulhern Belting

Mulhern Belting, located on Osborne Drive, is one of the largest conveyor belting wholesalers and fabricators in the world. As the company increased sales in recent years, it outgrew its 30,000 square foot facility.



In late 2012, the company purchased and moved into a vacant 60,000 square foot facility right across the street. The new facility provides the company with double the square footage so it can continue to grow.

Sawasdee Thai Cuisine

Sawasdee Thai Cuisine, located at 6600 Dixie Highway in the Diplomat Village shopping center, recently expanded into the vacant storefront next door. The restaurant opened in late 2010 with only a few tables in a small storefront. After a successful first couple of years, it now has added more tables for customer seating and some additional storage space in the back.

Jeff Wyler Cadillac is completing a major renovation of its showroom and service department. This project comes on the heels of the 2011 major renovation of the Jeff Wyler Nissan dealership next door. Together, these dealership investments serve to strengthen the Route 4 Auto Mile.

Skill Levels

Must be at least six years old or be able to pass the skills learned at the Turtle level. Skill taught include: *Safe entry and exit • Underwater exploration with objects • Controlled bubble blowing • Front and Back floats with recovery • Changing directions • Treading hand and arm movements • Front and back stroke combined arm and leg action • Personal water safety • Helping others in distress*

Seal: ARC Level 2 Fundamental Aquatic Skills



Fishing Lake Rules & Regulations

In addition to Fairfield Parks and Recreation Board Sites Rules and Regulations, the following Fishing Lake Rules will be enforced:

- Fishing Tickets are non-transferable.
- No rain checks.
- No refunds. All sales are final.
- Limit two (2) poles per Adult and Youth ticket. Child limited to one (1) pole. Additional pole tickets may be purchased.
- A ticket is required for all persons on the lake during overnight fishing.
- Throw and trot lines are not allowed.
- A total of eight (8) fish may be kept per ticket, excluding carp and bluegill.
- All fish over twenty-five (25) pounds remain property of the lake and must be released after weighing in.
- No purchasing or trading of fish.
- All fish must be checked in at the bait house prior to leaving the park.
- Fishermen catching or possessing any fish over the daily bag/possession limit will be charged Market Price per fish.
- All vehicles must be parked in the parking lot.
- Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on premises.
- Glass containers are not allowed.
- Snagging/netting of fish is not allowed.
- Frogging is not allowed.
- Cleaning of fish is not allowed in the park.
- Boats are not allowed.
- Swimming/wading is not allowed.
- Dogs are not allowed during overnight fishing.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WINTER WEATHER POLICY

City endorses service line plan

Residents sometimes receive mailings that look official or purport to be government-endorsed products or services. Often, however, they are not. But by the end of April, each homeowner will receive a letter from Public Utilities Director David Crouch that is a bona fide endorsement of an insurance plan that covers residents in the event a water or sewer line breaks in the area for which they are responsible, usually between their foundation and the connection to public lines near the street.

The insurance program is offered by the National League of Cities, of which Fairfield is a member. The plan is a Service Line Warranty that covers up to \$4,000 in repairs to a broken water or sewer line (*and up to \$4,000 in additional costs if the street needs to be repaired following work*). The plan is offered for an introductory monthly fee of \$4.50 for

water lines and \$6.00 for sewer lines. (*Annual fees are \$49 for water lines and \$67 for sewer lines.*)

In the event of a broken line, a resident calls a service center which immediately contacts a local contractor to repair the line without any additional charge to the resident, usually within 24 hours. There are no deductibles or additional fees required for a covered repair.


The warranty program is underwritten by Service Line Warranties of America, which has been in business for a decade and holds an A+ rating with the Better Business Bureau.

The Service Line Warranty Program is offered as a protection to homeowners who otherwise may be financially devastated by a repair bill that often ranges from \$1,200 to \$3,500. For more information about the plan, visit www.utilitylineprotection.com

Jason Hunold named new Wastewater Superintendent

Long-time Wastewater employee has been appointed as the division's new Superintendent. Jason Hunold first started working for the City of Fairfield in 1994 as a part-time laborer in grounds care at the City's Wastewater Treatment Plant. When summer ended, he left his job, but returned to his part-time position the next summer. He liked it so much that he never left, accepting a full-time job with the City. Over the years, he has worked in every classification within the Wastewater Division, learning and growing with each assignment.

Hunold rose through the ranks and was appointed to Chief Operator at the Wastewater Plant in 2008. When long-time Wastewater Superintendent Drew Young announced his retirement, Jason was prepared to fill his shoes. The only hurdle was that he needed to



earn an Ohio EPA Class IV Wastewater certificate.

The certification is a major undertaking, requiring completion of a 600 page, 12 chapter report; similar to a college thesis. With only weeks to spare before his interview for the Superintendent selection, Jason presented his report and passed the requirements for a Class IV license. He was the only Class IV candidate to pass the requirements on the first attempt in 2012.

Hunold was selected for the position out of a field of 70 applicants. While landing the new job was in itself a great reward, Hunold is quick to cite his Class IV Certification as his crowning professional achievement.

With an emphasis on establishing leadership depth within the Public Utilities Department, Hunold will begin cross-training for Water Superintendent duties in order to offer support for that division as well.

Hotline fields property maintenance concerns

Is there a property in your neighborhood that could use some attention? Springtime brings out the lawn mowers,

but if a nearby home is vacant, chances are that the yard isn't being cut and the grass will grow higher than the eight-inch maximum height allowed by City ordinance.

While neighbors may be aware of an owner's absence, City officials often do not know about it until someone reports the issue. The sooner the City is made aware, the sooner the legal proceedings can be initiated. Neighbors can anonymously report an unkempt yard — or other needed maintenance — by calling the Zoning Hotline at 867-5321.

After official notice has been served on the property's owner, the City can then arrange to have the yard mowed and the expense placed as a lien against the property. The legal process takes about four weeks.

On average, the City arranges for 60-80 yards each year to be mowed due to the neglect of the property. Some properties that need ongoing maintenance are carried over from the previous year.

Other issues can be reported by calling the

Hotline. These issues include:

- Poorly maintained roofs and gutters.
- Swimming pools and associated safety devices (both inground and above-ground), that are not properly maintained.
- Inoperative and/or unlicensed motor vehicles and trailers.
- Motor vehicles or trailers that are parked on the lawn.
- Accumulations of rubbish and garbage.

Monthly brush/limb pick-ups just a call away

With summer yard work in full swing, residents may want to take advantage of the City's monthly curbside brush and limb pick-up program. The service is available upon request by calling the Public Works Department at 867-4200 or by sending an email request to publicworks@fairfield-city.org. So that residents can be sure they are placed on the route, calls should be made at least a week in advance of the desired pick-up.

Pick-up requests are placed on a monthly route. Areas west of Pleasant Avenue are picked up the first week (*starting the first Monday*) of the month. Areas between Pleasant and Winton Road are served in the second week. On the third week of the month, pick-ups are made in areas east of Winton Road. The service is available by request through October 25.

Brush/Limb Pick-up Guidelines:

- Under the program, limbs must be at least six feet long and no more than six inches in diameter. (*All debris is processed through a chipper which cannot accommodate limbs larger than six inches.*)
- Branches shorter than six feet in length must be placed in cans, or tied together using a natural, biodegradable cord (*cotton, linen or twine*). Bundles tied with wire, plastic or nylon cord cannot be picked up.
- Bundles must weigh no more than 60 pounds.
- Brush deposited into cans cannot contain rocks or other materials since they can cause damage when run through the chipper and/or cause serious injury to the operators.

- Bundles and limbs must be placed at the edge of the street, but not beyond the curb or on the pavement.
- Pickups are limited to once per month per household.
- Service must be scheduled at least one week in advance, since crews prepare pickup routes by address and do not run regular routes through neighborhoods.

Other Options

- Residents may also drop off brush and limbs (up to four inches in diameter) at a location just north of Waterworks Park on the second Saturday of each month from 8 a.m. to noon. For large jobs, residents may also arrange for a "dump box" or a dump truck to be left at their residence. When filled, the City will remove the box and dispose of the contents.

Programs offer disposal for unusual items

From time to time, a resident may need to discard an item not regularly picked up in the weekly curbside service offered by Rumpke. Items such as an old mattress, a large piece of furniture or an appliance can still be discarded, but the resident must call Rumpke at 742-2900 to arrange for the pick-up since they are too large for a regular collection truck (*or too bulky for one person to safely handle*).

Guidelines for large item pick-up are:

- Calls must be made at least 24 hours before the regular day of pick-up. In the event arrangements were not made in time for a pick-up, the item must be stored out of view from the street.
- Only one item can be picked up each week.
- Mattresses and box springs must be wrapped in plastic.
- Appliances must be certified as free of freon (*see below for alternate pick-up service*).

Appliances with Freon:

Appliances with freon cannot be placed for curbside pick-up if the environmentally-



harmful gas has not been reclaimed. These items include refrigerators, air conditioners, freezers and dehumidifiers. The Butler County Solid Waste District, however, has arranged for these items to be collected by calling (*tollfree*) 1-888-886-9268. The service is offered from April through October without charge.

• An appointment can be arranged for a

service technician to pick up the unit so that the gas can be reclaimed and the metal recycled. The resident can arrange to place the unit out for the pick-up and does not have to be home to meet with the technician.

Household Hazardous Waste

Items such as paint, fluorescent bulbs, automotive fluids/oil, batteries (household and auto), varnish, stains, lacquer, pesticides, herbicides, antifreeze, propane tanks, acids, pool chemicals, adhesives and fire extinguishers should not be included in regular trash pick-ups. Instead, these items can be dropped off weekly from May through October. Items can be dropped on Thursdays from 2 to 7 p.m. at:
