Fairfield Police Department Honored by National Alliance On Mental Illness

The Fairfield Police Department was recognized in March by the Butler County Chapter of the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) at its recent award dinner. The department was nominated by Kathy Becker, CEO of Transitional Living Inc., a mental health service agency, for Excellence in Law Enforcement.

The Fairfield Police Department for over 14 years has been actively engaged in supporting individuals with mental health, addiction, and developmental disabilities needs. The Fairfield Police actively refer individuals to programs to assist with resources and needed services. The department's proactive outreach and intervention often results in the individual being referred for treatment rather than facing charges and being arrested. When arrest does occur, the Fairfield Police refer individuals to Fairfield Mental Health Court to assist in treatment options. The Fairfield Police are proactive with mental health, often calling to have mental health

professionals meet them to start the referral process. Mental health professionals ride along with police officers in order to follow up on individual cases. Since 2001, Fairfield Police have initiated over 1,000 mental health referral call-outs just to Transitional Living, Inc. Arrest rates for individuals with mental health needs have averaged less than five percent. Ride-alongs number well over 500.

Fairfield police officers have made presentations locally and nationally on their proactive model of responding to persons with mental illness. The model recognizes that the long-term solution to many individuals with problems requires intervention and treatment. Fairfield police officers receive mental health training on numerous occasions.

Our thanks to NAMI and Kathy Becker for the fine services they have provided to



the Fairfield Police Department in terms of training and response to persons in crises. Kathy and the Transitional Living staff have also become personal friends and part of the services we provide to Fairfield. Ours is an excellent partnership that is truly valued.

New! Utility Billing Website

The Fairfield's Utility Billing office has launched a new Utility Billing website, where customers can pay their bills and access general information about their account. The new site provides a secure internet connection to current real-time account balance information.

To access the site, customers will need a current utility bill with their account number and customer number. Once on the site, customers can

view their itemized utility bills for the past 12 months, see a 12-month record of water usage, and pay their bills. Payments made online are acknowledged with an electronic receipt emailed to the payee.

Continued online payment features:

- Visa, Master Card and Pay by eCheck will continue to be the acceptable methods of payment with no service fee.



- Utility bill payments are posted the following business day.

More to Come

Over the next few months, expect to see additional improvements to the site as we work to bring our customers more timely and useful information.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Generator Installed

Making sure that a strong infrastructure is in place is paramount to a thriving community. The Public Utilities Department works hard to ensure that their part of this infrastructure is carefully constructed.



A few tidbits regarding this powerful new tool:

- The generator has a maximum kilowatt (kW) output of 1,200 kW.
- The generator is powered by dual 1000 Horsepower (HP) diesel engines.
- The transfer switch is a new, state of the art switch allowing Wastewater Plant staff to monitor all aspects of incoming power, ultimately allowing for optimal power consumption and cutting energy costs.
- The generator is currently online and in standby mode waiting for its need.



The Wastewater Plant is required to have standby backup power in order to provide continuous service in the event of a power outage. The Public Utilities Department worked out a partnership with Duke/Power Secure to install a standby backup power generator and transfer switch. They have been working on the generator/transfer switch installation logistics for a little over a year.

Recently the staff completed the final tie-in and start-up of a new standby backup power generator/transfer switch. The switch transfers power demand to a backup power source in the event of a power outage.

City Manager Art Pizzano said, "The generator that was installed a few years ago at the Water Plant (aka Big Ike), coupled with the one now installed at the Wastewater Plant (aka Big Dave), will allow us all to rest a bit easier during the next major weather emergency."

manage energy use


- Improving the fuel efficiency of its vehicular fleet

Building Investment above 5 year average

After a steady rise from 2011 to 2013, building investment totals dipped slightly last year in Fairfield. During 2014, valuations on building permits totaled \$30.9 million, a nearly 10% decrease over 2013 totals, but still well above the latest five year average. Commercial building investment in 2014 totaled \$25.4 million, while residential building investment totaled \$5.6 million. These figures are monitored closely by Fairfield development officials, since they represent important trends. ☺

Cincinnati Bell Moves Fairfield onto Fiber Network

Fairfield is one of the first cities in Ohio to have an all-fiber network for voice, video and Internet service. Cincinnati Bell announced in December it is moving small business and residential customers in Fairfield onto the company's fiber network to meet the demand for high-speed Internet and other services that traditional copper lines cannot support. At the same time, the company will also be removing equipment from the network that no longer meets its standards for reliability and performance.



Fiber offers multiple advantages for businesses and consumers, including gigabit Internet service, which is up to 100 times faster than typical download speeds. That's important as businesses increasingly turn to cloud-based applications that require high-speed connectivity.

Fiber's increased bandwidth is equally

important for consumers, who expect reliable connectivity as they bring more smart devices into the home.

Economic development agencies across the country view fiber networks as an important tool for business expansion and attraction. Many tech startups, for example, rely on a lightning-fast Internet connection to begin building their business. Mature businesses looking to relocate expect the speed and reliability fiber provides.

Cincinnati Bell currently covers more than 40 percent of the region with its fiber network, and expects to have about 80 percent of the region covered by the end of 2016. Two Industrial Expansion Projects Underway

Element Materials Technology



Element Materials Technology is a global network of laboratories with experts specializing in materials testing, product qualification testing and failure analysis. The company employs more than 1,000 scientists, engineers and technicians in laboratories across the United States and Europe. It contracts with numerous customers in a wide variety of industries, including aerospace & defense, oil & gas, automotive parts, and biomedical devices.

In 2014, Element purchased Fairfield-based Accutek Testing Laboratory, located at 3701 Port Union Road. Element currently has two other facilities in Sharonville and in Woodlawn. In an effort to increase operational efficiencies, Element will consolidate its three local facilities into Fairfield.

Element will invest nearly \$2.5 million into the facility. The major components of the project include the construction

of new mezzanine office space and the conversion of warehouse space into new office and laboratory space. Element currently employs 40 at the Fairfield site. Upon completion of the project, it will close its other two local facilities, relocating 20 jobs from Sharonville and 50 from Woodlawn. The company will also create at least 10 new jobs within one year. In total, the Fairfield facility will eventually house at least 120 positions.

Calvary Industries



Calvary Industries, Inc. was founded in Fairfield in 1983 as a chemical compounding supplier and manufacturer. Since its founding, the company has grown to three locations (two in Ohio and one in Louisiana) with more than 100 employees. Calvary offers chemical formulating, custom processing, and blending for numerous

industries, including food and dairy products, industrial applications, and janitorial products.

Due to recent growth and newly signed contracts, Calvary needs additional warehouse and distribution space. Calvary considered both its Fairfield facility and its Louisiana facility for this

project before choosing to expand in Fairfield. The company will construct a 16,000 square foot addition to its existing facility, located at 9233 Seward Road. Total new investment is estimated at more than \$1.3 million. Calvary will retain its existing 38 jobs and will create at least 8 new jobs within two years of the completion of construction.

The mission of Fairfield Parks and Recreation is to enrich the quality of life for the citizens of the community, sustain the City's natural resources and environment and provide broad based leisure activities, cultural opportunities, facilities and services for all ages.

PROGRAM CANCELLATION DUE TO INCLEMENT WINTER WEATHER POLICY
At times, unforeseen circumstances can disrupt operations and force management to cancel programs. In making these determinations, Management staff carefully considers the safety and security of the general public and Department staff.

The department will issue cancellation announcements through its current media outlets, City website and signage at facilities. Information will also be available on the automated hotline at 896-8400.

CLASSES are defined as registered or drop-in programs that are leader-directed and offered at a predetermined time.

ACTIVITIES are self-directed programs or services that do not require registration.

SCHEDULED EVENTS are defined as meetings, private rentals, theater rentals, theater productions and special events taking place at a facility during a predetermined time.

CANCELLATIONS: The decision to conduct CLASSES during normal hours of operation will be made by 8 am whenever possible.

WHEN FAIRFIELD CITY SCHOOLS CLOSE: If Fairfield City Schools close due to inclement winter weather, all CLASSES offered through the Parks and Recreation Department/Fairfield Community Arts Center will be canceled until 5p.m. The decision to conduct evening CLASSES starting after 5 p.m. will be made by 4pm. Any CLASSES that are scheduled at a Fairfield City School location will be canceled for that evening as well. CLASSES that occur during a time period that school is closed for Winter Break or a Holiday will take place and follow the SCHEDULED EVENTS and ACTIVITIES guidelines. If facilities remain open, all SCHEDULED EVENTS and ACTIVITIES will occur as planned. Clients with SCHEDULED EVENTS may choose to cancel their events.







Fishing Lake Rules & Regulations

In addition to Fairfield Parks and Recreation Board Sites Rules and Regulations, the following Fishing Lake Rules will be enforced:

- Fishing Tickets are non-transferable.
- No rain checks.
- No refunds. All sales are final.
- Limit two (2) poles per Adult and Youth ticket. Child limited to one (1) pole. Additional pole tickets may be purchased.
- Children under 16 years of age must be accompanied by an adult.
- A ticket is required for all persons on the lake during overnight fishing.
- Throw and trot lines are not allowed.
- A total of eight (8) fish may be kept per ticket, excluding carp and bluegill.
- All fish over twenty-five (25) pounds remain property of the lake and must be released after weighing in.
- No purchasing or trading of fish.
- All fish must be checked in at the bait house prior to leaving the park.
- Fishermen catching or possessing any fish over the daily bag/possession limit will be charged Market Price per fish.
- All vehicles must be parked in the parking lot.
- Alcoholic beverages are not allowed on premises.
- Glass containers are not allowed.
- Snagging/netting of fish is not allowed.
- Frogging is not allowed.
- Cleaning of fish is not allowed in the park.
- Boats are not allowed.
- Swimming/wading is not allowed.
- Dogs are not allowed during overnight fishing.

Pleasant Avenue Gets New Water Main

The first of four phases of a project to replace the aging water main line on Pleasant Avenue began on February 16th. The new twelve inch ductile iron pipe is being installed from Resor Road north to Crestwood Lane. During construction, every effort will be made to minimize the impact to local residents and the motoring public. As with any water main reconstruction project some inconvenience can be expected. Residents are being notified of water service interruptions via the CodeRED notification system. The project is slated for completion in ninety days.

The water main being replaced is among the oldest part of the water system and has served the community nearly sixty years. The section of pipe between Evalie Drive and Crestwood Lane is currently fourteen inch cast iron. It is being replaced with a smaller diameter pipe based on our research of the water system hydraulics. The original piping was installed in the 1950s along with a water storage tank or “standpipe”. The pipe was designed to handle the water that was pumped up to the water storage tank and allowed the flow of water back down to town by gravity. The original standpipe held 200,000 gallons

of water and was located at a site on Jeffrey Place. By the early 1970’s, Fairfield had outgrown the small standpipe and it was decommissioned after the three million gallon-tank in Harbin Park Hunter Tank was placed in service.

The water main replacement on Pleasant Avenue is part of a comprehensive replacement program that calls for 1-2 % of the 169 miles of water main being replaced annually. The plan for replacement or rehabilitation addresses those

The number one enemy of our underground water mains is corrosion which makes them weak and vulnerable to breaking. Our current standards require a thicker ductile iron pipe that is wrapped in polyethylene plastic wrap to protect the pipe from corrosion. The pipe is properly “bedded” in a granular stone material to allow some movement as the ground freezes and thaws and traffic drives over it. This bedding mate-



water mains that have a high likelihood and/or consequence of failure. Replacing or rehabilitating mains in the high-risk areas first is a “surgical” phase for the City to address mains that pose a risk for imminent failure and high impact should they fail.

rial also provides some protection from corrosion. By installing these modern pipeline materials in this way, the City is assuring a very long service life of the water mains of 100 years or longer into the future.

A word about national storm water regulations...

The City of Fairfield, like most other cities across the country, is required by law to have a permit to operate its storm sewer system. Fairfield is regulated under the NPDES Phase II program that was developed by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (NPDES stands for National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System). The basic purpose of the NPDES program is to improve the water quality of streams, lakes, and other surface waters.

To obtain its Phase II permit, Fairfield was required to develop a storm water quality management plan that is based on six different types of activities:

1. Public Education
2. Public Involvement
3. Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination
4. Construction Runoff Control
5. Post-Construction Storm Water Management
6. Improving Municipal Operations

Every time it rains, thousands of gallons of storm water enters Fairfield's storm sewer system. As the runoff flows across lawns, driveways, parking lots, and streets, it collects pollutants such as motor oil, yard clippings, pesticides, herbicides, fertilizers, or other toxins. Since storm water is naturally channeled to our streams, rivers, or the underground aquifer, there is no opportunity for treatment to remove pollution. So, each of us must be careful to minimize — or eliminate — substances which may inadvertently pollute our waterways when it rains.

What Fairfield is doing to improve our storm water quality

1. Sweeping streets, cleaning catch basins and labeling storm drains.
2. Offering leaf and brush pickup services
3. Controlling construction site erosion.
4. Regulating development within the City's wellhead protection area (the area over the City's underground water supply).
5. Inspecting the storm sewer system to find and eliminate pollution sources.
6. Distributing educational materials to the public.

Ten easy ways YOU can stop storm water contamination

- 1** Recycle your used motor oil. On annual collection days, take household hazardous wastes to drop-off points. Never pour used motor oil or other hazardous materials into a storm drain. Contact the Butler County Solid Waste Management District for more information on recycling and disposal at (513) 887-3653.
- 2** Properly manage and dispose of yard wastes (grass clippings, leaves, etc.) and don't put them in the street, gutter, backyard ditch, or a storm drain. Contact the Fairfield Public Works Department for more information on leaf and brush pickup programs offered by the City at (513) 867-4200.
- 3** Use a proper container for your trash and recyclables. Don't put trash into the street or gutter where it can be washed into the storm sewer system. For more information on recycling, contact Rumpke at (513) 742-2900.
- 4** Always follow the manufacturer's instructions when using pesticides, herbicides, or fertilizers on your lawn or garden. Please don't "double the dose" just for good measure.
- 5** If you have a dog, clean up its waste and don't allow it to pollute storm water runoff. You can properly dispose of pet waste by flushing it down the toilet or placing it in the trash for regular pickup. Do not deposit pet waste in storm drain.
- 6** Use water-based paints such as latex and wash paint brushes in the sink with water. When using paint thinner, reuse and recycle it. Never pour unused paint or paint thinner into a storm drain.
- 7** Regularly maintain your car and fix any oil, radiator, or transmission leaks as soon as you see them. Also, consider using a commercial car wash instead of washing at home. The runoff from home car washing can contain detergents that are harmful to aquatic life.
- 8** Use non-toxic alternatives to conventional household cleaners whenever possible. Contact the Butler County Solid Waste Management District for more information.
- 9** Educate your family, friends, and neighbors about storm water pollution. Spread the word.
- 10** If you see a potential storm water quality problem, please call the City of Fairfield Public Works Department at (513) 867-4200. Remember, water pollution is everyone's concern.

Safe Drop-off for Household Hazards

As the beginning of summer approaches, the City of Fairfield Fire department encourages all residents purchasing pool chemicals, herbicides and pesticides to only purchase what they would anticipate needing for the duration of the season. Each year the fire department receives numerous calls about disposing of old pesticides and herbicides which can be costly for the home owner. More importantly, old containers often leak over a period of time and the hazards associated with a spill and the cost of cleaning it up often is problematic for the homeowner. Although "sales" are enticing we encourage homeowners not to purchase these types of chemicals in large quantities.



The Butler County Recycling & Solid Waste District offers a HHW program (**HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE PROGRAM**).

ACCEPTED ITEMS: Residents can drop off their oil-based paint, antifreeze, gasoline/motor oil, pesticides/fertilizers, solvents/thinners, cleaners, household/auto batteries, fire extinguishers, propane tanks, mercury thermometers, fluorescent bulbs (all sizes), driveway sealer, thermostats and lawn/pool chemicals.

UNACCEPTED ITEMS: *Latex paint, radioactive material, medical waste, explosives/ammunition, smoke detectors, tires, yard waste, electronics (computers/televisions), garbage, roofing material, appliances, heating oil/fuel tanks, unmarked cylinders, fireworks/gun powder and prescription drugs.

LATEX PAINT:

Latex pain can be allowed to air dry, then be disposed in regular trash. The introduction of kitty litter or saw dust will speed the drying of the latex paint. 
PRESCRIPTION MEDICATION:

2015 Pleasant Avenue Improvements

Beginning in May, the south end of Pleasant Avenue will briefly transform into a construction zone while crews work to widen the pavement to accommodate an additional lane between John Gray Road and Augusta Boulevard. The extra pavement will allow the City to extend the southbound left turn lane onto John Gray and add a center turn lane into the commercial properties. In addition to the widened pavement, other improvements include work to upgrade storm sewer, utility, and guardrail facilities. The final product will include a fresh top layer of pavement and bright new pavement markings.



A recent safety study found a higher number of southbound accidents in this stretch of road and recommended the work included in this project. The Ohio Department of Transportation will administer the project and provide 90% of funding through an ODOT Safety Grant. The remaining 10% will be provided by Fairfield.

No road closures are anticipated, although construction is expected to impact traffic with temporary lane

closures in addition to typical construction zone delays. Drivers are asked to avoid the area if possible. Construction is expected to wrap up in August.

National Flood Insurance Program Reforms

The National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) is in the process of implementing Congressionally mandated reforms required by the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014. The changes will take effect on April 1, 2015.

The new law slows some flood insurance rate increases and offers relief to some policyholders who experienced steep flood insurance premium increases in 2013 and 2014.

Beginning on April 1, 2015, the flood insurance rates and other charges will be revised for new or existing policies. In addition to insurance rates, other changes resulting from the Biggert-Waters Flood Insurance Reform Act of 2012 and the Homeowner Flood Insurance Affordability Act of 2014 will be implemented. These changes will affect the total amount that a policyholder pays for a flood insurance

policy. Please call your insurance agent to discuss any policy or premium changes that these new reforms may pose.

Zoning Hotline

Many times people are unaware of City rules and regulations that affect their private property. The property maintenance code adopted in the City of Fairfield Codified Ordinances was developed to maintain properties in good condition, keep Fairfield a community where people want to live and work and to ensure that Fairfield property values remain at their maximum.

Some of the more common problems we see:

- Tall grass
- Roof and gutter failures.
- Improper maintenance of in-ground and above-ground swimming pools.
- Inoperative and/or unlicensed motor vehicles and trailers.
- Motor vehicles or trailers parked in grass or on gravel.

- Rubbish and garbage accumulations.

If you see a property that looks as if it has been abandoned, grass is over 8 inches tall, or other property maintenance issues, let us know about it. For your assistance and confidentiality, the city has developed a "Zoning Hot Line" (513-867-5321) which allows you to talk to a zoning inspector or leave a voice message after hours, which will be addressed the next business day.
