State Route 4 Bypass Widening – Fairfield, Ohio (City of Fairfield)



The project widens the intersection of the Bypass and Port Union Road, constructs an additional bridge over the CSX railroad, and modifies the intersection with a new Quadrant Roadway Intersection (QRI) – the first in the United States. Residents and businesses in Butler County benefit from improved access to the major north-south corridor in the area, relief from traffic congestion on local roads, and improved safety in the area.
